

Moline Public Library's 3D Printing service provides access to emerging design technologies through 3D printing services to inspire and help the community bring 3D creations to life.

All 3D printing will be performed by designated Moline Public Library staff members. Patrons may not operate the 3D printer.

Moline Public Library's 3D printer may be used only for safe and lawful purposes. Patrons will not be permitted to use the library's 3D printer to create weapons or materials that are:

- Prohibited by local, state, or federal law
- Unsafe, harmful, dangerous, or that pose a threat to the well-being of others
- Likely to fail or print incorrectly or likely to cause damage to the 3D printer
- Obscene or inappropriate for the library environment
- In violation of another's intellectual property rights, e.g. the printers will not be used to produce objects which violate copyright, patent, or trademark protection

Moline Public Library reserves the right to:

- Set a time limit as to the maximum amount of time a print job may take
- Set a fee for the production and materials to print 3D objects
- Limit the number of requests
- Stop the project due to time or equipment capabilities
- Refuse to print any object at staff's discretion
- Display print job while in process.

The library cannot guarantee confidentiality of printed designs.

The library cannot guarantee that a print job will be ready on a specific day. Patrons will be notified when a print job is available for pick up via the contact information provided.

Printed items must be picked up within two weeks from the date of the first notice. Items not picked up become property of the library.

Pricing is based on final post production weight of the object(s). Patrons will not be charged for the cost of failed prints.
